

Ethnic minority children living in Hong Kong may face many emotional problems related to their cultural differences, identity, language barriers, family background, social integration, and other factors. Emotional programs can help them to recognize and understand their emotions, improve their emotional regulation, reduce emotional stress, and enhance social support and a sense of belonging. By providing emotional support through art-making, such as assisting them with self-expression, the group can help members to address these issues and promote their mental health.

# First Aid Training



First aid is very important for everyone to learn because it would help people in emergency situations. Therefore, HOPE Centre organized a first aid training for youth to train them in some basic first aid skills. We invited a professional first aid tutor Mr. Gary to teach the participants and give them practical exercises for better learning of the skills. # Dragon Boat Tour

Hong Kong has many beautiful places that people can explore, one of them being the dragon boat base in Ap Lei Chau. We brought our youth to visit the dragon boat base and learn about dragon boat races during the Dragon Boat Festival. The participants were able to learn about the culture of dragon boat racing and they made mini paper dragon boats with the help of the tour guide. The tour was very informative and let the participants know more about the Dragon Boat Festival.







# Poster Design Workshop





Participants were taught how to create their own posters using Canva. With the various tools at their disposal, they were able to let their creativity flow. They were most interested in the animation feature on Canva, creating flying bees and moving clouds on their posters. By using Canva, kids were able to experiment with different fonts, colors, and layouts to create visually appealing posters. This hands-on activity not only fostered artistic expression but also equipped children with valuable digital skills that can be applied in various future endeavours.



## AIESEC Talk

We invited AIESEC to bring their youth volunteers

to learn and interact with HOPE Centre. We introduced them to HOPE Centre and the service that we provide. After that, we had a brief sharing with ethnic minority participants to talk about their personal experiences of living in Hong Kong.


